Dear Music Educator

The Berry/Kauffold Scholarship is designed to help students further their music education. The purpose of our scholarship is to provide monetary incentives to musically talented high school students. The money can be used to purchase/lease new or upgraded instrument(s) or to offset expenses for band camp or for private instrumental instruction from a qualified teacher or program. The award of scholarship support is based upon completion of the **application** and the **recommendation forms** and a two-to-five minute video/audio file. Through this program, we will be awarding \$2000 to deserving high school students in Michigan.

Our goal is to encourage long-term involvement in music performance and to make students aware of the opportunity to continue performance with a community music experience and to pursuing music education after high school.

Scholarship applicants must currently be in the ninth (9th) through eleventh (11th) grade and must be current members of their high school instrumental or orchestral music program. Student Guidelines 2022-2023

APPLICATION FORMS

Forms will be available ONLINE (https://michiganoptimists.org), from an Optimist Club President or from High School Instrumental Music directors.

ELIGIBILITY

Ninth through Eleventh Grade students, currently enrolled in a school band or orchestra program are eligible provided they meet any one or more of the following criteria:

- 1. Attend High School in the state of Michigan.
- 2. Are sponsored by a current Michigan District Optimist Club

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Berry/Kauffold Scholarships may only be used for the purpose of furthering a student's involvement in Music Education. This can include any of the following: Private lessons, instrument rental or payment costs, summer music camp. Payment will be made directly to the student upon receipt of expense report and costs verification for projected expenses, as agreed by committee.

Scholarship Awards will be made at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee and must be used by September 15, 2023. The decisions of the Scholarship Committee and Judges are final.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

<u>Candidates must complete ALL of the following by the deadline of April 1, 2023</u> in order be considered for scholarship support.

- 1. Submit a completed and signed application.
- 2. Submit a reference form from their current music director, or private lesson instructor. Although a signature alone is required, a letter of recommendation is <u>highly suggested</u> and bears value in decisions.
- 3. Submit a two to five minute audio/video file showcasing the level of ability, such as a solo, etude or challenging section from of a piece of music from class.

SCHOLARSHIP PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

Scholarships will be awarded during the Michigan District Optimists Third Quarter Conference in May. Time and date TBD and will be announced. Should this award presentation be postponed or cancelled due to Covid 19, the award announcements will be made via USPS mail.
